Defined by the Brundtland Commission in 1987 'Our Common Future'






What is CSR?

Corporate social responsibility (CSR) is about the **core behaviour** of companies and the responsibility for their **total impact** on the societies in which they operate. CSR is not an optional add on nor is it an act of philanthropy. A socially responsible corporation is one that runs a profitable business that takes account of all the **positive and negative environmental, social and economic effects** it has on society"

What are Graduate Attributes?

'Graduate attributes are the qualities, skills and understandings a university community agrees its students should develop during their time with the institution. These attributes include but go beyond the disciplinary expertise or technical knowledge that has traditionally formed the core of most university courses. They are qualities that also prepare graduates as agents of social good in an unknown future.'

Bowden, Hart, King, Trigwell & Watts (2000)

The Student Experience

Revise policy to impact on engagement — addressing the quality of the total student experience for all students, not merely the quality of instruction. *This means bridging the gaps between academic, administrative and support programs* — a substantial challenge for many universities





The Student Experience (1994 Group)

- A requirement to provide transparent and accurate information around the student experience
- 2) Towards the 2020 Workforce: Promoting the well-rounded graduate
- 3) Promoting the student voice
- 4) Engagement with schools and colleges
- 5) Student-focused resources


