5. HEFCE / Carbon Footprinting

Shared concern over the best way to monitor emissions based on the HEFCE Guidelines. Everyone was conscientious that the methodology may change and so apprehensive to start anything yet.

lan Goodwin (MMU) is working with an external consultant to build a SAPs system to measure the University's carbon footprint.

Action – Caroline Radnor to discuss with David Somervell (University of Edinburgh). Ben Tongue (Bradford University) has offered to take the lead when necessary.

6. CycleScheme

HRMC have changed the process of the Scheme making the final payment criteria more problematic. The final payment costs have increased and this is leading to a number of universities wanting to remove membership to the Scheme. Some have already suspended the Scheme.

The changes contradict the DfT's Cycle Guarantee Scheme which encourages CycleScheme membership.

ACT are working with PTEG and Campaign for Better Transport – they are due to publish a paper and lobby HRMC.

Group agreed that the EAUC should lobby HRMC – **Action: Caroline** Radnor to discuss with lain Patton.
