
Travel Directions to Woodbrooke Quaker Study Centre



By Rail

Trains arrive into Birmingham New Street, Moor Street and Snow Hill stations. From New Street station you can catch a bus, taxi, or local train to Selly Oak. Local trains to Selly Oak take about 10 minutes. From Selly Oak station, Woodbrooke is a short bus ride on either the 61 or 63 (go to the ticket office, turn left outside the station and the bus stop is just a few yards down the main road).

By Foot (20-25 minutes from Selly Oak station)

If you are walking from Selly Oak station, go to the ticket office, turn left outside the station and walk to the main Bristol Road. Turn left and walk for approximately 1 mile away from the city towards Northfield. Continue walking down the Bristol Road, keeping the dual carriageway on your right hand side. You will pass the Christian Life Centre, the local Quaker Meeting House and Fircroft College. Woodbrooke's entrance is on the left before the bus stop.

By Bus

You can catch the 61 or 63 from the city centre or from outside New Street station (do not go up the escalators, keep to the left past WH Smiths and follow the path towards the bus stops; the stop is the last one). Ask for the 'Witherford Way' stop. After passing through Selly Oak, get ready to get off as the bus begins to go down the hill. Buses accept the exact fare only so please make sure you have plenty of change with you. At time of print (02/2011) single fare is £1.80 and a day saver is £3.60. See map on reverse.

By Bicycle

Local train operator London Midland welcomes bicycles on board all off-peak services free of charge. From Selly Oak station, Woodbrooke is a 5–10 minute cycle. Detailed cycle routes from the city centre are available upon request or by visiting our website.

By Coach

National Express coaches terminate at Digbeth Coach Station, a 10–15 minute walk from New Street (see map on reverse), from where you can travel by bus or train. Alternatively, pre-book a taxi to Woodbrooke (see By Taxi for details).

By Taxi

There is a taxi rank at New Street Station. The distance to Woodbrooke is approximately 4 miles. Ask for Woodbrooke Quaker Study Centre, 1046 Bristol Road, Selly Oak, B29 6LJ. If you want to pre-book a taxi from Birmingham New Street or Selly Oak train station, call local taxi company Roundabout Cars on 0121 453 1234 or Castle Cars on 0121-472 2222.

By Car

From the M6, leave at Junction 6 (Spaghetti Junction) and take the M38 Aston Expressway into Birmingham city centre, onto an overpass, through three tunnels and on to the Bristol Road A38. Keep going on this road, through Selly Oak and past Sainsburys on your right. You will pass the Christian Life Centre, the local Quaker Meeting House and the entrance to Fircroft College. Woodbrooke is the next college; the entrance is just after the speed camera and before the bus stop on the left.

From the M42, leave at Junction 2 and take the A441 towards Birmingham (signposted Cadbury World). After 6 miles, turn left onto the A38 Bristol Road. Woodbrooke is on the left after Fircroft College.

From the M5, leave at Junction 4 and take the A38 north for 6 miles towards Birmingham. After passing under a footbridge (after Bournville College), look out for Woodbrooke 200 yards beyond on the right. Go further up the hill and do a U-turn through the next gap (as signposted) to come back down the hill to the Woodbrooke entrance just before the bus stop on the left.

By Air

The nearest airport is Birmingham International. It takes between 10 and 20 minutes from Birmingham International train station to reach Birmingham New Street depending on which train you take. From there, you can get a local train to Selly Oak, a taxi or bus to Woodbrooke.


For Travellers with Disabilities

Catching a bus from Birmingham city centre



Map of city centre bus stops. Buses 61 or 63 leave from stops CD (Corporation Street), NC (Stephenson Street) and VC (St Martin's Queensway) They take you to just outside Woodbrooke.

From Digbeth Coach Station walk up Digbeth and through the Bull Ring Shopping Centre (going past St Martin's Church and up the slope between the two main shopping precincts). Turn left after the large bronze bull statue and go past the Tourism Centre. Bus stop **VC** is on your left.
